However, to facilitate your thought process, I suggest that you ask yourself an additional question: How old is the version of Progident/Clinic that I use?


If we define the concept of "age of the version" as the amount of time that has elapsed since the last update of a given version was marketed, here are the ages of the last four versions of Progident/Clinic:
